AP 4201 Appendix C: Site-Based First Aid Information

Purpose: This document outlines the procedures for providing first aid at the workplace, ensuring compliance with WorkSafeBC safety regulations. These procedures are reviewed annually and made available at all worksites and to be posted on Health and Safety boards.

How to call for first aid: To summon the f workplace communication system (e.g., r	radio, public address system).			
Emergency notification: In the event of a	n injury, notify the first aid attendant immediately.			
Response Procedures				
Upon notification, the first aid attendant	will:			

- Proceed to the injured person's location with necessary equipment.
- > Assess the situation and provide appropriate treatment based on training.
- > Notify the supervisor as soon as possible.



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Addressing Barriers to First Aid

If access is obstructed (e.g., by equipment or remote locations) alternative routes will be used as prearranged and outlined by the first aid attendant. Employees trained in emergency response will assist with moving the injured individual.

Authority and Responsibilities

Authority of the first aid attendant. The first aid attendant determines the appropriate treatment at the worksite. Workers must follow instructions unless overruled by a healthcare professional.

Reporting responsibilities

Supervisors must report Worker's Report of Injury or Occupational Disease to Employer (Form 6A) injuries to:

- Manager of Safe Schools & OHS
- > HR Advisor

Supervisors must report School Protection Program (SPP) Submissions:

Secretary-Treasurer

Transportation of Injured Workers

The first aid attendant will notify the supervisor of the need to arrange transportation.

Transportation Method: Ambulance services for emergencies, dial 9-1-1

As per the Worker's Compensation Act 33.29 (1) The employer must provide and pay for the immediate conveyance and transportation of an injured worker to the location of initial medical treatment of a work-related illness or injury. (2) The employer's obligation under subsection (1) is to the nearest hospital, or to the nearest physician or qualified practitioner prepared to accept responsibility for the required treatment.

Prearranged Routes

Workplace access routes. Emergency vehicle access routes are the entrances of each location. These routes are maintained to ensure unobstructed entrances and exits.

Review and Posting

These procedures are reviewed annually during safety meetings and updated as needed. Copies of this Appendix must be posted on the Safety Bulletin Boards.
