How the program works (overview)

A student must do the following:

- 1. Earn a scholarship and satisfy all eligibility requirements;
- 2. Pay tuition and start their program;
- 3. Receive their paper voucher in the mail (by the end of November);
- 4. Ask their post-secondary institution or program provider to stamp and sign their voucher;
- 5. Redeem their voucher with the Ministry; and,
- 6. Wait for their cheque to arrive in the mail



Understand the requirements to redeem a scholarship

- 1. Your scholarship(s) must be valid.
 - 1. Check the expiry date on the top right-hand corner of the voucher(s) or in your <u>Student Transcripts</u> Service account.
- 2. You must be enrolled with a post-secondary institution that is <u>designated by the Province of B.C.</u> (i.e., approved for Canada Student Loans), or a post-secondary program provider that is <u>approved by SkilledTradesBC</u>. If your chosen school is not listed, consider asking it to seek designation.
 - 1. Exception: to redeem a Pathway to Teacher Education scholarship, you must be attending an <u>approved teacher</u> <u>education program at a B.C. post-secondary institution</u>. To qualify, the program must be a teacher education program which leads to certification to teach in the B.C. K–12 school system. Accordingly, some programs do not qualify for this purpose, such as a Minor in Education.
- 3. You must have paid tuition that is equal to or greater than the value of your scholarship(s).
 - 1. Look for the value(s) on the top right-hand corner of the voucher(s) or in your <u>Student Transcripts</u> Service account.
- 4. Your program must have already started.

Eligibility

To earn a scholarship, students must apply and:

- 1. Meet the basic eligibility requirements
- 2. Meet criteria determined by the local scholarship committee, which requires a student to demonstrate outstanding achievement in any ONE of the following areas:
- Indigenous Language & Culture Demonstrated at school or in the community
- Fine Arts (e.g. Visual Arts, Drama, Music)
- Applied Design, Skills, & Technology (e.g. Business, Technology, Home Economics, Information Communication Technology, Technology Education)
- Physical Activity (e.g. Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
- International Language International Languages Curriculum or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses
- Community Service (Volunteer Activity) which includes demonstration of local and global issues and intercultural awareness
- Technical & Trades Training (e.g. Carpentry, Automotive, Woodwork, Mechanics, Cook Training)
